

## Sunday

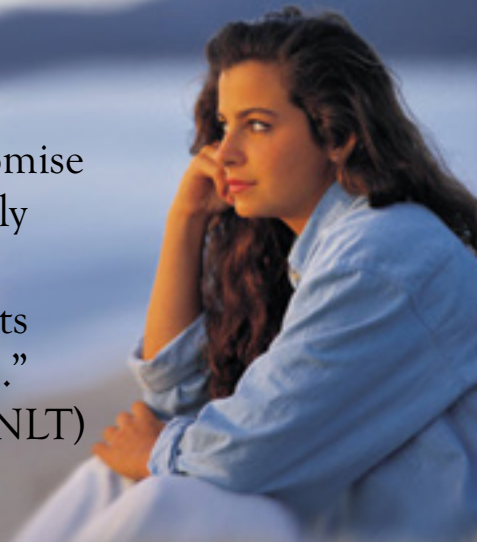
Father,
